# Assurance Framework School Growth Plan Fall Results 2021-2022

Located in the heart of Gregoire, Greely Road School is central to the education and wellbeing of the children and families in the neighborhood. In response to COVID-19, the school expanded to include the elementary component of E-cademy+, providing parents and students across FMPSD with an online alternative to brick and mortar schools. Although E-cademy+ was designed for students with physical medical needs, it expanded to serve the needs of those families who for various reasons feel a home-based online learning platform is best. While E-cademy+ Elementary is a program within Greely Road Public School, the core mission of the school is the same; to provide the best education to the students while taking a holistic approach to care for their physical and mental well being, understanding that in order for children to learn they must feel safe and secure.

To ensure the students of Greely Road Public School are cared for physically and emotionally, we are proud to provide breakfast to all students through a nutrition grant and provide lunches for those students who are unable to provide ones for themselves. We are also fortunate to have a school counselor who is on-site twice a week who works with students and families, to help guide them to mental wellness. For E-cademy+ we are very fortunate to have the support of counselors across the district to assist our online learners, as well as the support from the district office. All students enrolled in Greely Road Public School are taught and are encouraged to practice the 7 Habits, through the Leader in Me program.

Literacy is addressed based upon benchmarking from Fountas and Pinnell from grades 1-6. Based upon student reading levels, various interventions and strategies are put into place. These include but are not limited to Reading Eggs, Lexia, and small group intensive literacy support to improve fluency and comprehension. The school, through the Fundraising Association, was able to purchase classroom libraries for all classes and the Library has been reorganized with the goal of making reading an enjoyable experience. Numeracy, through the use of MIPI, is addressed through a combination of online resources, interventions, as well as in-class instruction, with small group support.

This year Greely Road School is in the process of implementing the Collaborative Response Model, as a way to support all students, build professional relationships, and improve teacher practice. As the community school Greely Road school has reached out in the community, albeit adjusting for COVID. We were very proud to be able to have run the Angel Tree fundraiser, as well as food drives.

Greely Road continues to be a school serving the needs of students, families, and the community.

- Utilizing our LAC, Allison Mitchell, for ½ time pull out literacy/numeracy support for our students.
- o Denise McKinley will continue working to support literacy, with a special focus in grades 1 to 3.
- o Utilizing our School Counsellor to teach classes Zones of Regulation, WITS and provide targeted Mental Health support

GROWTH AREA: Writing - Although no data from PATs for Greely Road School has been now going on for two years, the last results on the narrative writing portion for grade six were below the provincial average, and of the writing assessed there was no category where the school scored above satisfactory. There have been strides in improving literacy and writing, however, there has not been a school-wide plan in terms of common assessments and practices, which will help students improve, especially as they transition from one grade to the next.

ACTION FOR IMPROVEMENT: Writing - Staff will be working towards creating assessments both summative and formative, based around the 6+1 traits of writing combined with Empowering Writers, that can be adjusted for each grade level, while at the same time using a common language which will allow for a more scaffolded approach to writing as they become more proficient writers. This common language will aid staff as staff work with the Collaborative Response Model to improve their practice and student proficiency.

**GROWTH AREA: Reading -** Reading: On the last PAT available or student reading comprehension we scored 63%, the provincial average was 73%. This year we have many students, especially in division one who are behind grade-level expectations.

ACTION FOR IMPROVEMENT: Reading - With continued support from division office personnel, mainly our literacy coordinator, we will continue to learn and apply effective strategies to improve student learning. Through the CC3, the LENS, Fountas & Pinnell, and Literably data (E-cademy+), and using the Collaborative Response Model Framework, we will utilize our staff expertise to meet the needs of our students

GROWTH AREA: Mental Health - Our school survey data shows that student anxiety is higher than the Canadian average, with some age groups in division two almost double the national average with 40% reporting high anxiety. This is vital for our school and community, beyond the general well-being of the children, it is much harder to learn when in a state of heightened anxiety.

ACTION FOR IMPROVEMENT: Mental Health - Staff will be working as a whole to help lower student anxiety, with guidance from our school counselor. We will also be reviewing our classroom practices and school-wide practices to identify what we may be doing well to reduce student anxiety, as well as what practices may be in place which may raise student anxiety and adjust accordingly. We will also be focusing on the well-being of staff, as they must be able to take care of themselves so they can care for our students.

#### Student and staff needs:

Student writing and reading levels are a continuing focus for improvement across all grades. Staff and student mental health is a continuing focus during the pandemic. Students are struggling with high

anxiety and our boys in Division 2 are well below the national average with only half of them indicating that they have positive relationships at school.

- 1. Leader In Me professional development for new staff on implementation
- 2. Collaborative Response Model discuss strategies for students
- 3. Literacy Focus support from Division Office Literacy Coordinator.

- 6. Collaboration time to discuss assessment practices
- 7. Mental Health workshop with district specialists on anxiety

#### **FNMI Achievement:**

Ongoing school-wide focus to **Applying Foundational Knowledge about First Nations**, **Metis**, **and Inuit**: teacher developing and applying foundational knowledge about First Nations, Metis, and Inuit for the benefit of all students. A focus on supporting **Reconciliation** by including First Nations, Metis, and Inuit perspectives and experiences in classroom instruction. Professional Development activities and resource reviews for staff as part of PLFs. Ongoing collection of literacy and numeracy data with targeted interventions as needed. Building positive relationships with our students and families through our cultural navigators.

#### **ELL Achievement:**

The CC3, Lens, and Literably assessment data, as well as the Alberta Education's ELL Benchmarks, will be a focus for improving reading and writing skills. Students will be supported by universal and targeted literacy inventions by the school LAC with the guidance of the division literacy coordinator. We will also be utilizing the new literacy position to support school literacy initiatives and interventions.

#### Goals for 2021-2022:

**Priority #1**: Improve Literacy: Writing - Implementing 6 Traits & Empowering Writers to have common writing structure and assessment practices. Provide professional development support and resources for teachers.

**Priority #2:** Improve Literacy: Reading - Collecting data using the LENs, CC3, Benchmarking and Literably to implement universal classroom strategies as well as targeted interventions. Ongoing professional development and support for teachers and the purchase of appropriate resources.

**Priority #3:** Improve Mental Health: Improve student anxiety and positive relationships - work with our counselor to teach our students regulation strategies, social skills (friendship skills) and build a school culture of inclusion and belonging.

#### Impact of Reporting System Update on Derived Measures

  - New achievement, improvement, and overall evaluations based on the restated results were calculated for the impacted measures.

#### Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic on 2019/20 Provincial Assessments and Student Outcome Measures

- Participation in the Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) and Diploma Examinations was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
  - Results for the 2019/20 school year are not available for the PATs, Diploma Examinations, and Diploma Exam Participation Rate.
  - Caution should be used when interpreting Rutherford Scholarship Eligibility Rate results over time.
- In the absence of the Diploma Exams, achievement level of diploma courses were determined solely by school-awarded marks. Caution should be used when interpreting **High School Completion Rate** results over time.

### **Achievement Evaluation**

# **Appendix – Definitions for Measures and Key Terms**



The **First Nations**, **Métis and Inuit** results reported for the Alberta Education Assurance Measures only include students that self-identified as First Nations, Métis or Inuit on student registration forms. School authorities are required to report on Alberta Education Assurance Measure results for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students in their 3-year education plans and annual education results reports for the purpose of monitoring and improving education outcomes. Please ensure context and appropriate analysis are provided whenever results for self-identified First Nations, Métis and Inuit students are shared publicly.

**High School Completion Rate (3-year)** is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort¹ who have completed high school by the end of their third year, adjusted for attrition².

High school completion is defined as: receiving an Alberta high school diploma, certificate of high school
achievement (completion of Knowledge and Employability courses and the certificate requirements) or high
school equivalency (GED); entering a post-secondary level program at an Alberta post-secondary institution;
registering in an Alberta apprenticeship program; or earning credit in a minimum of five grade 12 courses,
including a Language Arts diploma exam course and three other diploma examination courses.

**Post-Secondary Transition Rate (6-year)** is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort who have entered a post-secondary-level program at an Alberta post-secondary institution or registered in an Alberta apprenticeship program within six years of entering grade 10, adjusted for attrition.

 An estimate of out-of-province post-secondary enrollment is applied based on the numbers of funded Alberta students attending post-secondary institutions out of province.

**Diploma Exam Participation Rate (4+Exams)** is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort who have written four or more diploma exams by the end of their third year in high school, adjusted for attrition.

• Students are not considered a diploma examination participant if they do not have an examination mark.

**Drop Out Rate** is the percentage of students aged 14 to 18 years registered in the Alberta Kindergarten to Grade 12 system who drop out the following year, adjusted for attrition.

- An initial age specific cohort of students aged 14 to 18 years is established for a given school year, excluding
  the following groups of students: students who are not registered on September 30th of the school year;
  students registered in schools not affiliated with Alberta (e.g. Lloydminster); students registered in schools under
  provincial or federal authorities; students identified as having a moderate/severe cognitive or severe multiple
  disability; visiting/exchange students; students attending Hutterite colony schools.
- A student who was in Alberta's education system is considered to have dropped out if:
  - There is no evidence of their participation in the Alberta education system the following school year (including in Alberta post-secondary and apprenticeship programs)
  - They did not complete high school (see high school completion measure for details).

Rutherford Scholarship Eligibility Rate is the percentage of Alberta grade 12 students who have met the eligibility criteria for a Rutherford Scholarship based on course marks in grades 10, 11 and/or 12.

Students must have completed at least one grade 12 course. Students in the following categories are excluded: students who are not registered on September 30th of the school year; students registered in schools not affiliated with Alberta (e.g. Lloydminster); students registered in schools under provincial or federal authorities; students identified in the grade 12 school year as having a moderate/severe cognitive disability or severe multiple disability; students identified in the grade 12 school year as visiting/exchange students; students 20 years of age or older on September 1 of the school year.

**Provincial Achievement Test (PAT) Results (Acceptable / Excellence)** are based on all students in each grade (total enrollment in the grade plus the ungraded students who are in the corresponding year of schooling). Results are calculated for each test. The overall result is the average of the results for each test weighted by the number of students enrolled.

- PAT acceptable is the percentage of students who achieve the acceptable standard on grades 6 and 9
  Provincial Achievement Tests.
- PAT excellence is the percentage of students who achieve the standard of excellence on grades 6 and 9
  Provincial Achievement Tests.

**Diploma Exam Results (Acceptable / Excellence)** are based on the numbers of students writing each diploma exam. The overall diploma exam result is the average of the results for each exam weighted by the number of students writing.

- Diploma exam result (acceptable) is the percentage of students who achieve acceptable standard (i.e. a mark of 50%) on a diploma exam.
- Diploma exam result (excellence) is the percentage of students who achieve the standard of excellence (i.e. a mark of 80%) on a diploma exam.

### **Survey Measures**

In public, separate and Francophone schools all students in grades 4, 7 and 10; their parents; and all teachers are included in the survey. In charter schools and level 2 private schools students in grade 4 and above; their parents; and all teachers are included in the survey.

- The measure results for parents and teachers are calculated by aggregating the responses to all questions that comprise the measure.
- The measure result for students is calculated by first aggregating the responses to questions within each grade grouping and then taking a simple average across grade groups.
- The overall measure result is calculated by taking the simple average of measure results for parents, teachers and students.

## **Table Headings**

For each table displaying measure history or 3-year Rolling Averages, **N** represents the size of the underlying cohort. For example:

- **N** is the size of the Grade 10 Cohort for High School Completion Rate, Post-Secondary Transition Rate, and Diploma Exam Participation Rate.
- **N** is the size of the age-specific cohort for Drop Out Rate.
- For survey measures, **N** is the number of respondents.



Some measures are calculated using several years of data. In these cases, the years displayed in the tables and charts reflect the latest years of data included in each calculation.






















## Advocacy at school
