Assurance Framework School Growth Plan Fall Results 2021-2022

Walter and Gladys Hill Elementary School is located in Eagle Ridge in Fort McMurray, Alberta. We have 506 students and 56 staff members. Our student body is composed of families and students from over 50 different countries, and this diversity is an asset to our school. On typical school years we celebrate diversity with a Multi-Cultural Night and a Chinese New Year, as we host the Confucius Program for language and culture instruction. We have higher numbers of English Language Learners, so we need to plan for providing extra time and support for these students.

Walter and Gladys Hill Elementary School has spent a year and a half aligning our school growth plans to goals set based on our needs and from data collected. Two school years have passed where many disruptions have taken place due to Covid-19, so the work that we are doing reflects the important need to identify potential gaps where our students are in literacy and numeracy.

We have gotten off to a decent start with our two primary goals: identifying gaps in and planning interventions for the literacy and numeracy needs of our students. Our work from November to December will be having our staff work on implementing interventions to address the priority gaps that we have identified. Data we collect from the new year and Professional Learning groups on Fridays will guide our progress in the new year until we report on our successes and challenges in the spring. Our school growth plan is a forward-looking document that will continue to evolve. We will continue to learn more about our students, celebrate achievements and growth, and spend our PLF time this year looking for steady improvement.

- Our school focus is supporting inclusion (III and Sensory Room), extra-curricular activities (Athletic, Artistic and Musical) and closing the academic, social and emotional gap for our students (two year Covid gaps, Literacy and Numeracy support, interventions)

STRATEGIES FOR MOVING FORWARD

1. PROFESSIONAL LEARNING FRIDAYS

CRM meetings are integrated into PLF Fridays, so CRM becomes the talk time while PLF becomes the work time. Our collaborative groups have been doing great work so far this year, and include time for mental health.

- 2. PHYSICAL RESOURCES
 - We are using a variety of old and new literacy and numeracy resources to make sure we are using them to their potential, and to try new things out.
- 3. HUMAN RESOURCES
 - Our Divisional consultants have spoken to us regarding Guided Reading, and ELL. Numeracy and literacy meetings have been ongoing.
- 4. BUDGET
 - We feel good about the resources we have purchased and used over the last two years. It is time to maximize them with our planning and utilization.

INDICATORS OF SUCCESS

SHORT TERM

- By the end of December, our plan to report on how our literacy and numeracy intervention tools have been working..
- Information on our plan for ELL supports and literacy progress will be compiled at our two December PLF times to track improvements.

MOVING TO - DESIRED STATE

- By spring break 2022, we want to analyze data from a variety of sources (CC3, Lens, MIPI, Fountas and Pinnell, Precision Reading, and ELLA) to tracks improvement levels for our students.

The WGH Narrative of Results

Since June of last school year, Walter and Gladys Hill Elementary has had the opportunity to review a number of data sources to direct our School Plan. For literacy needs, we have reviewed Fountas and Pinnell data, and our grade 2 and 3 students have completed the CC3 and Lens assessments provided by Alberta Education. For numeracy, we have completed the MIPI diagnostic and our grade 2 and 3 classes have completed the numeracy assessment for Alberta Education.

The AEA report was reviewed to assess stakeholder satisfaction, and the OurSchool report provided us a snapshot of student satisfaction in our building.

Most recently, we have completed the CHEQ survey for Kindergarten, and will make time to review this data as it provides a look at what our student needs will be years down the road.

We learned that our students need academic support with phonics, phonemic awareness and functions and patterns. These skills stood out as missing building blocks that have been negatively affected by two years of disrupted learning. We also learned that our students are resilient and that parents thought the quality of education was very high, a great statistic considering the stress caused by moving in and out of virtual learning. Our staff scored us the highest out of the three stakeholders, which is reassuring since most of the stress of virtual education was placed on their shoulders.

Last year's PLF plan focused on learning ways to navigate the pandemic while providing quality education. The focus had to be on teaching what was most important, so our groups focused on breaking down curricular content into virtual chunks. In preparation for this school year, our PLF plan concluded in June that the focus should be on identifying literacy and numeracy gaps, and then building a plan to provide appropriate interventions to those areas.

Our school has a 32% English Language Learner (ELL) population, so ELL interventions are critical to ensuring these students get extra help and support with literacy. Our universal approach to Tier 1 and 2 classroom interventions will help our ELL students, but we also target ELL support with a 0.5 FTE teacher who does intervention pullouts for ELL. As well, we are partnered with the Multicultural Association (MCA), and Natasha Gregorek tutors up to 16 students for 30 minutes per week. She recently was awarded a FMPSD Partners Award for her work with us and Thickwood School.

4% of our students are First Nations, Metis and Inuit (FNMI). Our data shows that our FNMI students typically are 1 to 2 reading levels behind their peers, so closing the gap is a priority for us. To support these students, we use Precision Reading, a tool that gives kids a chance to build their literacy skills once a week, with the ultimate goal of increasing confidence and skill in reading for our FNMI students.

Our school plan for the year is very straightforward.

- Identification of literacy and numeracy gaps through data collection

- Use universal tier I/II interventions to support the specific needs that our students face (functions and patterns, phonics, phonemic awareness)








NUMERACY SEPTEMBER 2021 SNAPSHOT







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What's New for Spring 2021?



This section outlines any changes to the data, calculations or measures compared to the May 2020 release.

Layout Update

- The report has been reorganized to align to the domains of the Assurance Framework.
- The "N/A" placeholder for the "Current Result" in the overall summary for the Provincial Achievement Test and Diploma Examination measures is included in the Spring reports until results can be updated in the Fall.

Data Updates

- New year of results for all survey measures.
- New year of results for all derived measures (Drop Out Rate, High School Completion Rate, Post-Secondary Transition Rate, Diploma Examination Participation Rate and Rutherford Scholarship Eligibility Rate).

Impact of Reporting System Update on Derived Measures

- Current and historical results for High School Completion Rate, Post-secondary Transition Rate, and Diploma Exam Participation Rate were restated to reflect an update to the Alberta Education Assurance Measure reporting system (formerly Accountability Pillar Online Reporting Initiative) to ensure concordance with the existing student outcome measures methodology.
 - New achievement, improvement, and overall evaluations based on the restated results were calculated for the impacted measures.

Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic on 2019/20 Provincial Assessments and Student Outcome Measures

- Participation in the Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) and Diploma Examinations was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
 - Results for the 2019/20 school year are not available for the PATs, Diploma Examinations, and Diploma Exam Participation Rate.
 - Caution should be used when interpreting Rutherford Scholarship Eligibility Rate results over time.
- In the absence of the Diploma Exams, achievement level of diploma courses were determined solely by school-awarded marks. Caution should be used when interpreting **High School Completion Rate** results over time.

Introduction of the Alberta Education Assurance (AEA) Survey and Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic

- Caution should be used when interpreting survey results over time as 2020/21 was a pilot year for the AEA survey and participation was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The 2020/21 survey results were not:
 - o Evaluated against the provincial standards (Achievement) or previous 3-year averages (Improvement);
 - o Included in the calculation of future provincial standards for new survey measures; or
 - o Included in the calculation of 3-year averages used to evaluate improvement of future survey results.
- A new "N/A" (i.e., not applicable) response on the parent, student and teacher AEA surveys allowed respondents to clearly indicate when a question was not applicable. A response of "N/A" does not count towards the total number of responses in the survey result.

Achievement Evaluation

Achievement evaluation is based upon a comparison of Current Year data to a set of standards which remain consistent over time. The Standards are calculated by taking the three-year average of baseline data for each measure across all school jurisdictions and calculating the 5th, 25th, 75th and 95th percentiles. Once calculated, these standards remain in place from year to year to allow for consistent planning and evaluation.

The table below shows the range of values defining the five achievement evaluation levels for each measure.







Diploma Exam Participation Rate











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







Appendix – Definitions for Measures and Key Terms



The **First Nations**, **Métis and Inuit** results reported for the Alberta Education Assurance Measures only include students that self-identified as First Nations, Métis or Inuit on student registration forms. School authorities are required to report on Alberta Education Assurance Measure results for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students in their 3-year education plans and annual education results reports for the purpose of monitoring and improving education outcomes. Please ensure context and appropriate analysis are provided whenever results for self-identified First Nations, Métis and Inuit students are shared publicly.

High School Completion Rate (3-year) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort¹ who have completed high school by the end of their third year, adjusted for attrition².

High school completion is defined as: receiving an Alberta high school diploma, certificate of high school
achievement (completion of Knowledge and Employability courses and the certificate requirements) or high
school equivalency (GED); entering a post-secondary level program at an Alberta post-secondary institution;
registering in an Alberta apprenticeship program; or earning credit in a minimum of five grade 12 courses,
including a Language Arts diploma exam course and three other diploma examination courses.

Post-Secondary Transition Rate (6-year) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort who have entered a post-secondary-level program at an Alberta post-secondary institution or registered in an Alberta apprenticeship program within six years of entering grade 10, adjusted for attrition.

• An estimate of out-of-province post-secondary enrollment is applied based on the numbers of funded Alberta students attending post-secondary institutions out of province.

Diploma Exam Participation Rate (4+Exams) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort who have written four or more diploma exams by the end of their third year in high school, adjusted for attrition.

• Students are not considered a diploma examination participant if they do not have an examination mark.

Drop Out Rate is the percentage of students aged 14 to 18 years registered in the Alberta Kindergarten to Grade 12 system who drop out the following year, adjusted for attrition.

- An initial age specific cohort of students aged 14 to 18 years is established for a given school year, excluding
 the following groups of students: students who are not registered on September 30th of the school year;
 students registered in schools not affiliated with Alberta (e.g. Lloydminster); students registered in schools under
 provincial or federal authorities; students identified as having a moderate/severe cognitive or severe multiple
 disability; visiting/exchange students; students attending Hutterite colony schools.
- A student who was in Alberta's education system is considered to have dropped out if:
 - There is no evidence of their participation in the Alberta education system the following school year (including in Alberta post-secondary and apprenticeship programs)
 - They did not complete high school (see high school completion measure for details).

Rutherford Scholarship Eligibility Rate is the percentage of Alberta grade 12 students who have met the eligibility criteria for a Rutherford Scholarship based on course marks in grades 10, 11 and/or 12.

Students must have completed at least one grade 12 course. Students in the following categories are excluded: students who are not registered on September 30th of the school year; students registered in schools not affiliated with Alberta (e.g. Lloydminster); students registered in schools under provincial or federal authorities; students identified in the grade 12 school year as having a moderate/severe cognitive disability or severe multiple disability; students identified in the grade 12 school year as visiting/exchange students; students 20 years of age or older on September 1 of the school year.

Appendix – Definitions for Measures and Key Terms



Provincial Achievement Test (PAT) Results (Acceptable / Excellence) are based on all students in each grade (total enrollment in the grade plus the ungraded students who are in the corresponding year of schooling). Results are calculated for each test. The overall result is the average of the results for each test weighted by the number of students enrolled.

- PAT acceptable is the percentage of students who achieve the acceptable standard on grades 6 and 9
 Provincial Achievement Tests.
- PAT excellence is the percentage of students who achieve the standard of excellence on grades 6 and 9
 Provincial Achievement Tests.

Diploma Exam Results (Acceptable / Excellence) are based on the numbers of students writing each diploma exam. The overall diploma exam result is the average of the results for each exam weighted by the number of students writing.

- Diploma exam result (acceptable) is the percentage of students who achieve acceptable standard (i.e. a mark of 50%) on a diploma exam.
- Diploma exam result (excellence) is the percentage of students who achieve the standard of excellence (i.e. a mark of 80%) on a diploma exam.

Survey Measures

In public, separate and Francophone schools all students in grades 4, 7 and 10; their parents; and all teachers are included in the survey. In charter schools and level 2 private schools students in grade 4 and above; their parents; and all teachers are included in the survey.

- The measure results for parents and teachers are calculated by aggregating the responses to all questions that comprise the measure.
- The measure result for students is calculated by first aggregating the responses to questions within each grade grouping and then taking a simple average across grade groups.
- The overall measure result is calculated by taking the simple average of measure results for parents, teachers and students.

Table Headings

For each table displaying measure history or 3-year Rolling Averages, **N** represents the size of the underlying cohort. For example:

- **N** is the size of the Grade 10 Cohort for High School Completion Rate, Post-Secondary Transition Rate, and Diploma Exam Participation Rate.
- **N** is the size of the age-specific cohort for Drop Out Rate.
- For survey measures, **N** is the number of respondents.

Values under the % column headings represent the rate for that cohort.

Some measures are calculated using several years of data. In these cases, the years displayed in the tables and charts reflect the latest years of data included in each calculation.

¹Grade 10 Cohort: Students are included in the Grade 10 Cohort in the first school year in which they have a grade 10 registration at a public, separate, Francophone, charter or accredited private school. The following categories of students are excluded from the Grade 10 Cohort:

a. students who register after September 30th of the school year;

b. students who are registered in schools under provincial and federal authorities, Lloydminster school authorities or other out-of-province schools:

c. students who have a concurrent grade 9 registration in the same school year;

d. adult students (older than 18 when they start grade 10);

e. students who are identified as having a moderate/severe cognitive disability or a severe multiple disability;

f. students attending Hutterite Colony schools; and

g. visiting or exchange students

Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic on 2019/20 Provincial Assessments and Student Outcome Measures

 - Results for the 2019/20 school year are not available for the PATs, Diploma Examinations, and Diploma Exam Participation Rate.
 - Caution should be used when interpreting Rutherford Scholarship Eligibility Rate results over time.
- In the absence of the Diploma Exams, achievement level of diploma courses were determined solely by school-awarded marks. Caution should be used when interpreting **High School Completion Rate** results over time.

Introduction of the Alberta Education Assurance (AEA) Survey and Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic

Appendix – Definitions for Measures and Key Terms



The **First Nations**, **Métis and Inuit** results reported for the Alberta Education Assurance Measures only include students that self-identified as First Nations, Métis or Inuit on student registration forms. School authorities are required to report on Alberta Education Assurance Measure results for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students in their 3-year education plans and annual education results reports for the purpose of monitoring and improving education outcomes. Please ensure context and appropriate analysis are provided whenever results for self-identified First Nations, Métis and Inuit students are shared publicly.

High School Completion Rate (3-year) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort¹ who have completed high school by the end of their third year, adjusted for attrition².

High school completion is defined as: receiving an Alberta high school diploma, certificate of high school
achievement (completion of Knowledge and Employability courses and the certificate requirements) or high
school equivalency (GED); entering a post-secondary level program at an Alberta post-secondary institution;
registering in an Alberta apprenticeship program; or earning credit in a minimum of five grade 12 courses,
including a Language Arts diploma exam course and three other diploma examination courses.

Post-Secondary Transition Rate (6-year) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort who have entered a post-secondary-level program at an Alberta post-secondary institution or registered in an Alberta apprenticeship program within six years of entering grade 10, adjusted for attrition.

 An estimate of out-of-province post-secondary enrollment is applied based on the numbers of funded Alberta students attending post-secondary institutions out of province.

Diploma Exam Participation Rate (4+Exams) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort who have written four or more diploma exams by the end of their third year in high school, adjusted for attrition.

• Students are not considered a diploma examination participant if they do not have an examination mark.

Drop Out Rate is the percentage of students aged 14 to 18 years registered in the Alberta Kindergarten to Grade 12 system who drop out the following year, adjusted for attrition.

- An initial age specific cohort of students aged 14 to 18 years is established for a given school year, excluding
 the following groups of students: students who are not registered on September 30th of the school year;
 students registered in schools not affiliated with Alberta (e.g. Lloydminster); students registered in schools under
 provincial or federal authorities; students identified as having a moderate/severe cognitive or severe multiple
 disability; visiting/exchange students; students attending Hutterite colony schools.
- A student who was in Alberta's education system is considered to have dropped out if:
 - There is no evidence of their participation in the Alberta education system the following school year (including in Alberta post-secondary and apprenticeship programs)
 - They did not complete high school (see high school completion measure for details).

Rutherford Scholarship Eligibility Rate is the percentage of Alberta grade 12 students who have met the eligibility criteria for a Rutherford Scholarship based on course marks in grades 10, 11 and/or 12.

Students must have completed at least one grade 12 course. Students in the following categories are excluded: students who are not registered on September 30th of the school year; students registered in schools not affiliated with Alberta (e.g. Lloydminster); students registered in schools under provincial or federal authorities; students identified in the grade 12 school year as having a moderate/severe cognitive disability or severe multiple disability; students identified in the grade 12 school year as visiting/exchange students; students 20 years of age or older on September 1 of the school year.

Appendix – Definitions for Measures and Key Terms



Provincial Achievement Test (PAT) Results (Acceptable / Excellence) are based on all students in each grade (total enrollment in the grade plus the ungraded students who are in the corresponding year of schooling). Results are calculated for each test. The overall result is the average of the results for each test weighted by the number of students enrolled.

- PAT acceptable is the percentage of students who achieve the acceptable standard on grades 6 and 9
 Provincial Achievement Tests.
- PAT excellence is the percentage of students who achieve the standard of excellence on grades 6 and 9
 Provincial Achievement Tests.

Diploma Exam Results (Acceptable / Excellence) are based on the numbers of students writing each diploma exam. The overall diploma exam result is the average of the results for each exam weighted by the number of students writing.

- Diploma exam result (acceptable) is the percentage of students who achieve acceptable standard (i.e. a mark of 50%) on a diploma exam.
- Diploma exam result (excellence) is the percentage of students who achieve the standard of excellence (i.e. a mark of 80%) on a diploma exam.

Survey Measures

In public, separate and Francophone schools all students in grades 4, 7 and 10; their parents; and all teachers are included in the survey. In charter schools and level 2 private schools students in grade 4 and above; their parents; and all teachers are included in the survey.

- The measure results for parents and teachers are calculated by aggregating the responses to all questions that comprise the measure.
- The measure result for students is calculated by first aggregating the responses to questions within each grade grouping and then taking a simple average across grade groups.
- The overall measure result is calculated by taking the simple average of measure results for parents, teachers and students.

Table Headings

For each table displaying measure history or 3-year Rolling Averages, **N** represents the size of the underlying cohort. For example:

- **N** is the size of the Grade 10 Cohort for High School Completion Rate, Post-Secondary Transition Rate, and Diploma Exam Participation Rate.
- **N** is the size of the age-specific cohort for Drop Out Rate.
- For survey measures, **N** is the number of respondents.

Values under the % column headings represent the rate for that cohort.

Some measures are calculated using several years of data. In these cases, the years displayed in the tables and charts reflect the latest years of data included in each calculation.

- a. students who register after September 30th of the school year;
- b. students who are registered in schools under provincial and federal authorities, Lloydminster school authorities or other out-of-province schools:
- c. students who have a concurrent grade 9 registration in the same school year;
- d. adult students (older than 18 when they start grade 10);
- e. students who are identified as having a moderate/severe cognitive disability or a severe multiple disability;
- f. students attending Hutterite Colony schools; and
- g. visiting or exchange students

¹Grade 10 Cohort: Students are included in the Grade 10 Cohort in the first school year in which they have a grade 10 registration at a public, separate, Francophone, charter or accredited private school. The following categories of students are excluded from the Grade 10 Cohort:

²Attrition: The loss of students due to out-migration and mortality, referred to as "attrition", is estimated from department and Statistics Canada data.

 - Results for the 2019/20 school year are not available for the PATs, Diploma Examinations, and Diploma Exam Participation Rate.
 - Caution should be used when interpreting Rutherford Scholarship Eligibility Rate results over time.
- In the absence of the Diploma Exams, achievement level of diploma courses were determined solely by school-awarded marks. Caution should be used when interpreting **High School Completion Rate** results over time.

Introduction of the Alberta Education Assurance (AEA) Survey and Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic

- Caution should be used when interpreting survey results over time as 2020/21 was a pilot year for the AEA survey and participation was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The 2020/21 survey results were not:

Appendix – Definitions for Measures and Key Terms



The **First Nations**, **Métis and Inuit** results reported for the Alberta Education Assurance Measures only include students that self-identified as First Nations, Métis or Inuit on student registration forms. School authorities are required to report on Alberta Education Assurance Measure results for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students in their 3-year education plans and annual education results reports for the purpose of monitoring and improving education outcomes. Please ensure context and appropriate analysis are provided whenever results for self-identified First Nations, Métis and Inuit students are shared publicly.

High School Completion Rate (3-year) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort¹ who have completed high school by the end of their third year, adjusted for attrition².

High school completion is defined as: receiving an Alberta high school diploma, certificate of high school
achievement (completion of Knowledge and Employability courses and the certificate requirements) or high
school equivalency (GED); entering a post-secondary level program at an Alberta post-secondary institution;
registering in an Alberta apprenticeship program; or earning credit in a minimum of five grade 12 courses,
including a Language Arts diploma exam course and three other diploma examination courses.

Post-Secondary Transition Rate (6-year) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort who have entered a post-secondary-level program at an Alberta post-secondary institution or registered in an Alberta apprenticeship program within six years of entering grade 10, adjusted for attrition.

 An estimate of out-of-province post-secondary enrollment is applied based on the numbers of funded Alberta students attending post-secondary institutions out of province.

Diploma Exam Participation Rate (4+Exams) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort who have written four or more diploma exams by the end of their third year in high school, adjusted for attrition.

• Students are not considered a diploma examination participant if they do not have an examination mark.

Drop Out Rate is the percentage of students aged 14 to 18 years registered in the Alberta Kindergarten to Grade 12 system who drop out the following year, adjusted for attrition.

- An initial age specific cohort of students aged 14 to 18 years is established for a given school year, excluding
 the following groups of students: students who are not registered on September 30th of the school year;
 students registered in schools not affiliated with Alberta (e.g. Lloydminster); students registered in schools under
 provincial or federal authorities; students identified as having a moderate/severe cognitive or severe multiple
 disability; visiting/exchange students; students attending Hutterite colony schools.
- A student who was in Alberta's education system is considered to have dropped out if:
 - There is no evidence of their participation in the Alberta education system the following school year (including in Alberta post-secondary and apprenticeship programs)
 - They did not complete high school (see high school completion measure for details).

Rutherford Scholarship Eligibility Rate is the percentage of Alberta grade 12 students who have met the eligibility criteria for a Rutherford Scholarship based on course marks in grades 10, 11 and/or 12.

Students must have completed at least one grade 12 course. Students in the following categories are excluded: students who are not registered on September 30th of the school year; students registered in schools not affiliated with Alberta (e.g. Lloydminster); students registered in schools under provincial or federal authorities; students identified in the grade 12 school year as having a moderate/severe cognitive disability or severe multiple disability; students identified in the grade 12 school year as visiting/exchange students; students 20 years of age or older on September 1 of the school year.

Appendix – Definitions for Measures and Key Terms



Provincial Achievement Test (PAT) Results (Acceptable / Excellence) are based on all students in each grade (total enrollment in the grade plus the ungraded students who are in the corresponding year of schooling). Results are calculated for each test. The overall result is the average of the results for each test weighted by the number of students enrolled.

- PAT acceptable is the percentage of students who achieve the acceptable standard on grades 6 and 9
 Provincial Achievement Tests.
- PAT excellence is the percentage of students who achieve the standard of excellence on grades 6 and 9
 Provincial Achievement Tests.

Diploma Exam Results (Acceptable / Excellence) are based on the numbers of students writing each diploma exam. The overall diploma exam result is the average of the results for each exam weighted by the number of students writing.

- Diploma exam result (acceptable) is the percentage of students who achieve acceptable standard (i.e. a mark of 50%) on a diploma exam.
- Diploma exam result (excellence) is the percentage of students who achieve the standard of excellence (i.e. a mark of 80%) on a diploma exam.

Survey Measures

In public, separate and Francophone schools all students in grades 4, 7 and 10; their parents; and all teachers are included in the survey. In charter schools and level 2 private schools students in grade 4 and above; their parents; and all teachers are included in the survey.

- The measure results for parents and teachers are calculated by aggregating the responses to all questions that comprise the measure.
- The measure result for students is calculated by first aggregating the responses to questions within each grade grouping and then taking a simple average across grade groups.
- The overall measure result is calculated by taking the simple average of measure results for parents, teachers and students.

Table Headings

For each table displaying measure history or 3-year Rolling Averages, **N** represents the size of the underlying cohort. For example:

- **N** is the size of the Grade 10 Cohort for High School Completion Rate, Post-Secondary Transition Rate, and Diploma Exam Participation Rate.
- **N** is the size of the age-specific cohort for Drop Out Rate.
- For survey measures, **N** is the number of respondents.

Values under the % column headings represent the rate for that cohort.

Some measures are calculated using several years of data. In these cases, the years displayed in the tables and charts reflect the latest years of data included in each calculation.

¹Grade 10 Cohort: Students are included in the Grade 10 Cohort in the first school year in which they have a grade 10 registration at a public, separate, Francophone, charter or accredited private school. The following categories of students are excluded from the Grade 10 Cohort:

a. students who register after September 30th of the school year;

b. students who are registered in schools under provincial and federal authorities, Lloydminster school authorities or other out-of-province schools:

c. students who have a concurrent grade 9 registration in the same school year;

d. adult students (older than 18 when they start grade 10);

e. students who are identified as having a moderate/severe cognitive disability or a severe multiple disability;

f. students attending Hutterite Colony schools; and

g. visiting or exchange students






Results Based on Number Enrolled Alberta (ESL)

PAT Results By Course - 3 Year Rolling Average








Results Based on Number Enrolled






Results Based on Number Enrolled Alberta (ESL)






Results Based on Number Enrolled Alberta (ESL)






Results Based on Number Enrolled Alberta (ESL)






Results Based on Number Enrolled Alberta (ESL)

Achievement Evaluation

Achievement evaluation is based upon a comparison of Current Year data to a set of standards which remain consistent over time. The Standards are calculated by taking the three-year average of baseline data for each measure across all school jurisdictions and calculating the 5th, 25th, 75th and 95th percentiles. Once calculated, these standards remain in place from year to year to allow for consistent planning and evaluation.

The table below shows the range of values defining the five achievement evaluation levels for each measure.

Improvement Table

For each jurisdiction, improvement evaluation consists of comparing the Current Year result for each measure with the previous three-year average. A chi-square statistical test is used to determine the significance of the improvement. This test takes into account the size of the jurisdiction in the calculation to make improvement evaluation fair across jurisdictions of different sizes.

The table below shows the definition of the five improvement evaluation levels based upon the chi-square result.

Appendix – Definitions for Measures and Key Terms



The **First Nations**, **Métis and Inuit** results reported for the Alberta Education Assurance Measures only include students that self-identified as First Nations, Métis or Inuit on student registration forms. School authorities are required to report on Alberta Education Assurance Measure results for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students in their 3-year education plans and annual education results reports for the purpose of monitoring and improving education outcomes. Please ensure context and appropriate analysis are provided whenever results for self-identified First Nations, Métis and Inuit students are shared publicly.

High School Completion Rate (3-year) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort¹ who have completed high school by the end of their third year, adjusted for attrition².

High school completion is defined as: receiving an Alberta high school diploma, certificate of high school
achievement (completion of Knowledge and Employability courses and the certificate requirements) or high
school equivalency (GED); entering a post-secondary level program at an Alberta post-secondary institution;
registering in an Alberta apprenticeship program; or earning credit in a minimum of five grade 12 courses,
including a Language Arts diploma exam course and three other diploma examination courses.

Post-Secondary Transition Rate (6-year) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort who have entered a post-secondary-level program at an Alberta post-secondary institution or registered in an Alberta apprenticeship program within six years of entering grade 10, adjusted for attrition.

 An estimate of out-of-province post-secondary enrollment is applied based on the numbers of funded Alberta students attending post-secondary institutions out of province.

Diploma Exam Participation Rate (4+Exams) is the percentage of students in the Grade 10 Cohort who have written four or more diploma exams by the end of their third year in high school, adjusted for attrition.

• Students are not considered a diploma examination participant if they do not have an examination mark.

Drop Out Rate is the percentage of students aged 14 to 18 years registered in the Alberta Kindergarten to Grade 12 system who drop out the following year, adjusted for attrition.

- An initial age specific cohort of students aged 14 to 18 years is established for a given school year, excluding
 the following groups of students: students who are not registered on September 30th of the school year;
 students registered in schools not affiliated with Alberta (e.g. Lloydminster); students registered in schools under
 provincial or federal authorities; students identified as having a moderate/severe cognitive or severe multiple
 disability; visiting/exchange students; students attending Hutterite colony schools.
- A student who was in Alberta's education system is considered to have dropped out if:
 - There is no evidence of their participation in the Alberta education system the following school year (including in Alberta post-secondary and apprenticeship programs)
 - They did not complete high school (see high school completion measure for details).

Rutherford Scholarship Eligibility Rate is the percentage of Alberta grade 12 students who have met the eligibility criteria for a Rutherford Scholarship based on course marks in grades 10, 11 and/or 12.

Students must have completed at least one grade 12 course. Students in the following categories are excluded: students who are not registered on September 30th of the school year; students registered in schools not affiliated with Alberta (e.g. Lloydminster); students registered in schools under provincial or federal authorities; students identified in the grade 12 school year as having a moderate/severe cognitive disability or severe multiple disability; students identified in the grade 12 school year as visiting/exchange students; students 20 years of age or older on September 1 of the school year.

Appendix – Definitions for Measures and Key Terms



Provincial Achievement Test (PAT) Results (Acceptable / Excellence) are based on all students in each grade (total enrollment in the grade plus the ungraded students who are in the corresponding year of schooling). Results are calculated for each test. The overall result is the average of the results for each test weighted by the number of students enrolled.

- PAT acceptable is the percentage of students who achieve the acceptable standard on grades 6 and 9
 Provincial Achievement Tests.
- PAT excellence is the percentage of students who achieve the standard of excellence on grades 6 and 9
 Provincial Achievement Tests.

Diploma Exam Results (Acceptable / Excellence) are based on the numbers of students writing each diploma exam. The overall diploma exam result is the average of the results for each exam weighted by the number of students writing.

- Diploma exam result (acceptable) is the percentage of students who achieve acceptable standard (i.e. a mark of 50%) on a diploma exam.
- Diploma exam result (excellence) is the percentage of students who achieve the standard of excellence (i.e. a mark of 80%) on a diploma exam.

Survey Measures

In public, separate and Francophone schools all students in grades 4, 7 and 10; their parents; and all teachers are included in the survey. In charter schools and level 2 private schools students in grade 4 and above; their parents; and all teachers are included in the survey.

- The measure results for parents and teachers are calculated by aggregating the responses to all questions that comprise the measure.
- The measure result for students is calculated by first aggregating the responses to questions within each grade grouping and then taking a simple average across grade groups.
- The overall measure result is calculated by taking the simple average of measure results for parents, teachers and students.

Table Headings

For each table displaying measure history or 3-year Rolling Averages, **N** represents the size of the underlying cohort. For example:

- **N** is the size of the Grade 10 Cohort for High School Completion Rate, Post-Secondary Transition Rate, and Diploma Exam Participation Rate.
- **N** is the size of the age-specific cohort for Drop Out Rate.
- For survey measures, **N** is the number of respondents.

Values under the % column headings represent the rate for that cohort.

Some measures are calculated using several years of data. In these cases, the years displayed in the tables and charts reflect the latest years of data included in each calculation.

¹Grade 10 Cohort: Students are included in the Grade 10 Cohort in the first school year in which they have a grade 10 registration at a public, separate, Francophone, charter or accredited private school. The following categories of students are excluded from the Grade 10 Cohort:

a. students who register after September 30th of the school year;

b. students who are registered in schools under provincial and federal authorities, Lloydminster school authorities or other out-of-province schools:

c. students who have a concurrent grade 9 registration in the same school year;

d. adult students (older than 18 when they start grade 10);

e. students who are identified as having a moderate/severe cognitive disability or a severe multiple disability;

f. students attending Hutterite Colony schools; and

g. visiting or exchange students

INTRODUCTION TO THE CHEQ

WHAT IS THE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES QUESTIONNAIRE (CHEQ)?

The CHEQ is a questionnaire used to gather information on children's experiences in their early environments prior to kindergarten. The questionnaire focuses on experiences in specific areas of development that are strongly linked to children's health and well-being, education and social outcomes. The information from the CHEQ helps us understand variability in children's early experiences so that educators, school districts and communities can provide better support and services to children and families.

WHY DO EARLY EXPERIENCES MATTER?

Development during the first years of life is highly influenced by a young child's experiences in their home and community. Research has shown that nurturing environments promote healthy child development. While good nutrition, shelter and protection are some of the basic aspects of nurturing environments; young children also need to spend their time in environments that include support from parents/caregivers and other adults. They need opportunities to explore their world, to play and to learn how to interact with others. These experiences help to build a strong foundation for healthy development over time.

WHY WAS THE CHEQ DEVELOPED?

Life-long health and well-being are a consequence of multiple determinants within the many intersecting environments in which children grow. Research shows that there is great variability in children's development by age 5, which present both risks and protective factors that influence developmental outcomes. To better understand this variability, a team of researchers at the University of British Columbia's Human Early Learning Partnership, in collaboration with educators, parents/caregivers and community stakeholders from across British Columbia, developed the CHEQ to measure the experiences of children prior to kindergarten. Information collected using the CHEQ is both comprehensive and actionable, and can be used to ensure that children have the opportunities and experiences they need to learn and grow.




Child's overall health in the last year
















Frequency the child ate a meal with another family member in the last 6 months








Does the child face challenges when sleeping at night?

Challenges faced by the child when sleeping at night








Days per week the child played outdoors over the last 6 months














How much time per day the child used an electronic device in general:




Was the child in a childcare arrangement other than parental care between 3 years and kindergarten?




Type of childcare arrangement between 3 years and kindergarten






Number of times the child has moved homes in the last 5 years


Length of time the child has lived in their current neighbourhood




Child ethnicity




Family ethnicity








Does the child currently live in more than one home?




Child's number of siblings






The <u>parent's/caregiver's</u> level of stress in the last six months due to the pandemic


How the <u>child's</u> use of services/supports were affected due to the pandemic


The effect of the pandemic on the job status or number of work hours per week for the <u>second parent/caregiver</u>


The effect of the pandemic on overall family income


